<p>Summary Methodology</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Analytical Framework, Concepts, Definitions, and Classifications • Scope of the data • Accounting Conventions • Nature of the Basic Data Sources • Compilation Practices 	<p>Currency in Circulation provides outstanding amount of currency in circulation showing the breakdown of by currency type and nominal value.</p> <p>This data series starts from the January 1970 reference period.</p> <p><u>Explanation</u></p> <p>Currency or cash is the most liquid form of money. There are two main types of currency: coins and banknotes. Currency in circulation consists of banknotes and coins that are circulated in the economy which excludes currency held by the issuer of banknotes (Bank of Thailand) and the issuer of coins (Treasury Department). Coins include all commemorative coins with designated nominal value that can be used for payments.</p> <p>Note that the Treasury Department is the only unit within the central government that performs the function of a central bank with respect to issuing money. Currency in circulation therefore excludes only currency held by the Treasury Department but includes the currency held by the rest of central government which does not perform central bank function.</p>
