Data are presented in the form of percentage share of each component (as appeared below) to the total export value.</p> <p>(1) FX receipts exchanged into baht: refers to export proceeds received in the form of foreign currency, which are then sold to commercial banks in exchange for baht.</p> <p>(2) Baht receipts through non-resident baht account: refers nonresidents' withdrawal of baht from their nonresident baht account to settle to the exporters for the goods purchased.</p> <p>(3) Payment on FX borrowings: refers to the use of export proceeds received in the form of foreign currency to pay off exporters' foreign-currency-denominated debt (borrowed from commercial banks).</p> <p>(4) Deposit to foreign currency account: refers to export proceeds received in the form of foreign currency, which are then deposited into foreign currency accounts (FCD).</p> <p>Data for the years 1993 - 2003 are obtained from F.T.30 form (foreign exchange position of commercial banks) and F.T.40 form (deposit to and withdrawal from nonresident baht account). Data for the years 2004 - present are obtained from "Datasets" on foreign exchange transactions reported to the Bank of Thailand by financial institutions.</p>
